6. Cargo flights

6.1 Landing in Mauritius

If an operator intends to operate a cargo flight to Mauritius, he shall apply to the Director of Civil Aviation at least 3 days in advance prior to operations of the flight if carrying general cargo and live animals and at least 2 weeks in advance if carrying dangerous goods on board.

The requirements for processing the application for a cargo flight are as follows:

- 1. Name, telephone number, email and postal address of operator;
- 2. Name and contact details of operator's representative available in the event of an emergency on H24 including Landline and mobile telephone number (including country and area codes); Fax numbers; Email addresses; AFTN addresses; & SITA addresses;
- 3. Billing address of operator (email and postal addresses);
- 4. Type of aircraft and registration mark(s);
- 5. Aircraft call-sign;
- 6. Type of cargo on board (including UN numbers in case dangerous goods are carried;
- 7. Aerodrome/country of origin;
- 8. Aerodrome/country of destination;
- 9. ETA/ETD;
- 10. Handling agent / operator's representative (if any): and
- 11. Noise Certificate of aircraft;
- 12. Statement from airlines that their aircraft have the necessary insurance cover, equipments on board and maintained in an airworthiness condition as per provision of Annex 6 Operations of Aircraft, Part I International Commercial Air Transport-Aeroplanes, Chapter 6 Aeroplane Instruments, Equipments and flight document and Chapter 7 Aeroplane Communication and Navigation Equipment
